Grade 8-9 Transitions

As students progress from elementary school to secondary school, important personal information is shared which eases each student's transition to secondary school. Sharing this information also improves our ability to program effectively to benefit all students. Select student information will be shared at different times as appropriate. The collection and use of personal student information for such purposes is authorized under sections 170, 171, 190 Part

X and Part X111 of the *Education Act*. Please note that all information used for the transition process is limited, secure and protected at all times. Elementary schools are now registering children for Kindergarten for the 2018-19 school year. 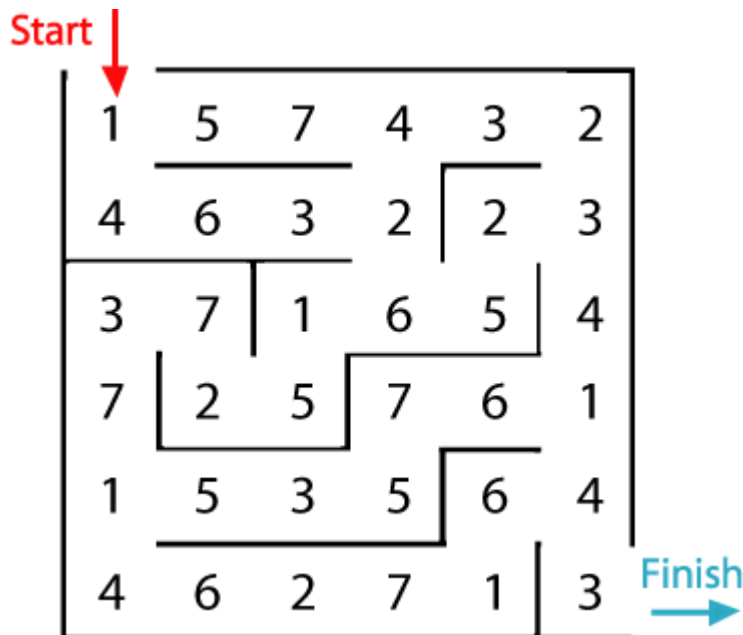
Understanding Alternative/Non-Academic IEP Goals
